

Message from Leader of Swanley Town Council



Dear All,

A belated Happy New Year to you all! There are a few things to update you on from a Sevenoaks District Council and Town Council side of things:

Sevenoaks District Council Local Plan

Sevenoaks District Council (SDC) is required by Government to produce a 'Local Plan' to state how and where housing will be

allowed to be built in order to meet future need (essentially housing targets). Failure to put together a Local Plan can mean that when individual planning applications come forward, the National Planning Inspector is likely to approve them, even if they are in Green Belt or in a protected area.

As part of that process, SDC is required to allow 10,500 new homes to be built across the District up until 2040. Having asked major landowners which plots of land are suitable, Pedham Place Golf Course (the other side of the M25 and opposite the end of Button Street where it meets Farningham Hill) has been put forward as a potential site for 2,500 homes. This is the same as it was in the last Local Plan, which overall was not approved by the National Planning Inspector, due to the failure to allocate enough land to build homes. Separate to that, there is also a proposal to put a major WASPS Rugby Stadium on the site or nearby.

The good news is that the 3000 home Garden Village between Swanley and Swanley Village has not been included at all this time around. There is also no major development proposed for the village.

However, the Local Plan doesn't look at potential development of a site with dwellings under ten, so that won't prevent any small-scale development potentially coming forward in Swanley Village in an individual planning application, as happens from time to time. I'm not aware of anything, but it's worth clarifying that point.

We will find out in March 2024 the next step for the proposals and which developments are likely to be put forward as the next part of the Local Plan.

Planning Applications

Harringtons Nursery (bottom of Highlands Hill) – I believe houses are now available for purchase on Rightmove. Cllr Chris Prestedge has also spoken with the developers and site manager about being more considerate of traffic and parking issues caused by construction vehicles, which appears to have improved.

Swanley LIDL – The planning application for this has now been granted. The store is proposed off London Road adjacent to Beechenlea Lane. It is proposed that a new roundabout be built between the bridge and Beechenlea Lane which will lead to the LIDL store, and 48 houses further up on the land behind Beechenlea Lane. No access to this will be via Beechenlea Lane, and local Councillors were successful in implementing a number of restrictions on site, such as store opening times (7-10pm) and store delivery times (only during those hours, not outside those hours).

Footpath – Highlands Hill – Sevenoaks District Council has approved funding from CIL (new development contributions) to improve the footpath from Harrington's Nursery to outside the Red Lion Pub. Although currently in very early stages, this should allow KCC to improve the footpath which runs up the back of the field to opposite the Red Lion, making it safer, more accessible and less muddy during the winter months. This will be a safer alternative, albeit slightly longer, to walking down Highlands Hill.

<u> Splash Park – Swanley Park</u>

Following much feedback and discussions, we have agreed to put a permanent 'booking' system in for the splash park. The splash park is immensely popular, and in Summer can be incredibly busy, often exceeding the numbers it was intended for. This year, we will be trialling a booking system for sessions in the park, in order to restrict numbers and make the experience far more enjoyable and safer for all. There will be NO CHARGE for this, and it is not our intention to create one, it will remain free.

As part of this, sadly we will have to erect a green mesh fence round the area. Experience has taught us that families often just pick up their children and place them over the wooden fence, therefore in a busy summer this would be unmanageable, and therefore a more robust fence is required. This also has added benefits, as it will prevent wild animals entering the pool at night, and prevent vandalism. We believe it will allow a better experience and more importantly, a safer one for all the young children.

County Councillor's Report Roger Gough



Following Kent Highways' consultation on the 20mph speed limit in various parts of the village, and with a Traffic Regulation Order having been signed off, we are awaiting the final design and pricing up stage. Once this is agreed and completed, it will be handed to a delivery team within Kent Highways who will deliver it within a 90 day window. So it's not quite imminent,

but it is getting a lot closer.

With regard to the overall condition of the roads, the good news is that the government has committed (via recycling some funding from HS2) £134.5 million to Kent over the next ten years for road maintenance and improvement. The less good news is that this will be backloaded, so £4.5 million per annum for Kent for the first two years. This is a sum that will not go very far in a county as big as Kent, but it is a start, and with predictable funding for the next few years we can launch initiatives such as our pothole blitz in the knowledge of what we can spend and when, delivering the best value for the funding that we have.

Before Christmas, KCC bid successfully for Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding from Sevenoaks District Council to support improvements to Rights of Way. This includes works to reinstate the full width and create an all weather surface on SD92, which should improve links from the Harrington's nursery end of Highlands Hill to the centre of the village. However, this project will not be within the first year's spend of the CIL funding, but hopefully can be worked up and delivered in 2025.


