Daphne Davis 1946-2024

Daphne and Geoff Davis came to Swanley Village in 1982 and took an active role in Village life. When there was a threat that the Channel Tunnel Rail Link would come out in the centre of the Village, they became fully involved in the fundraising activities of Swanley Action Group and this continued in their support for the Swanley Village Trust events, including "chicken and chili evenings" and bonfire nights. She and Geoff took over the running of the Trust's 100 Club which they ran successfully for many years.

Daphne was a committee member for the Residents'



Association, and she would regularly check streetlamps and report any faults. She was also very active in enforcing speed limits in the Village when the Village had a speed monitor – Daphne was a force to be reckoned with for any speeding motorists! Together Geoff and Daphne planted daffodils in various places around the Village, including the verge of Highlands Hill where they still provide a marvellous spring display.

Daphne and Geoff travelled worldwide over the many years until Geoff's death. Following his death and Covid, Daphne's health suffered, and she spent her final years being cared for in Emerson's Grange in Hextable.

Daphne will be long remembered for her outgoing nature and good humour as she played a major part in Village life. She will be much missed.

County Councillor's Report Roger Gough



The 20-mph zone has now been in place for some months. We are now looking at ways to enhance its effect with more signage and other measures. I will report back on progress on this.

I mentioned in the last newsletter that works were due to take place on the culvert on or before 6 November. The works will take place on that

date and will involve both cleansing the system and civils work to dig out the culvert and remove vegetation and debris. Hopefully that should avoid a repetition of some of the recent problems around the Swanley Village Road/ Button Street junction.

In this year's 'pothole blitz' (which in fact includes larger scale patching and preventative work), KCC's teams fixed 5,501 potholes and patched an area of 228,377m2. There are reports that government, will allocate more funds to councils for this; it is certainly needed. As we head into winter, pothole fixing will be more reactive and our crews are taking control of the gritters to keep the county moving through the cold weather, treating more than 1,500 miles of road and filling over 3,000 salt bins across the county.

District Councillor's Report Michael Horwood

First of all, can I wish you and your family a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!

There are a few Town Council events as usual celebrating the Christmas Season:

Saturday 30th November 2-6pm – Town Centre 'Light Up The Town' celebrations, including live music, an elf mascot, and Santa's Grotto. Light switch on is at 6pm.

Sunday 15th December at 4pm – St Marys Church Mayor's Civic Service which includes carols, the service and free mulled wine / mince pie refreshments afterwards.

By now you should have received your recycling '**Bag For Life**' which have replaced the singleuse white recycling sacks. Over the years, a number of residents have reasonably highlighted the irony of using single-use plastic sacks to collect recycling. Just to put it in context, we use millions of single-use plastic recycling sacks just to collect recycling across the District every year. A move to a 'bag for life' is an important part of helping reduce single use plastics, and ultimately reducing CO2 emissions. Understandably, this is a big change from the single use white recycling sacks we are all used to. The Council wanted to ensure that there is enough space for recycling that can fill several bags full of recycling waste, especially if it is forgotten to put out one week. It was also highlighted by residents that the bags needed to be slightly weighted at the bottom, to prevent them being blown away in moderate wind, though this of course has made the bag slightly heavier. There will be some residents who may need help carrying their bags from their property to the street. Sevenoaks District Council also offers a **free** '**assisted collection**' which will ask our operatives to collect it from a specific external place of your property. To request this free help simply telephone Sevenoaks District Council on 01732 227000.

Just a brief update on **planning issues** in our area. The main one is the proposed LIDL at the end of Beechenlea Lane. Works have started to demolish the 'Swanley Garage Doors' building on the main Swanley Road in order to prepare the site, hence the hoarding up.

There is also an adjacent site to this which includes the creation of four light industrial units, which is also intending to start work soon. The major proposal for this will be the creation of a **new roundabout** at the entrance to Swanley Garage Doors. There is no timeline as to when these works will come forward, although it is anticipated in 2025. No roadworks are ever welcomed, so we are asking Kent County Council to only approve plans which keep works to an absolute minimum. I will of course keep you updated once we know more about the timelines.
